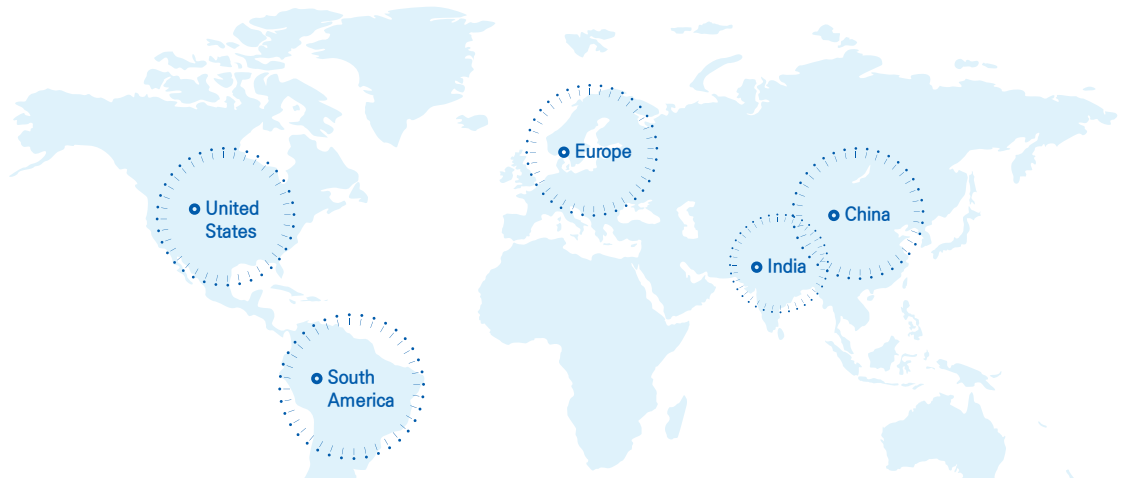

Global Production Network of HL Mando



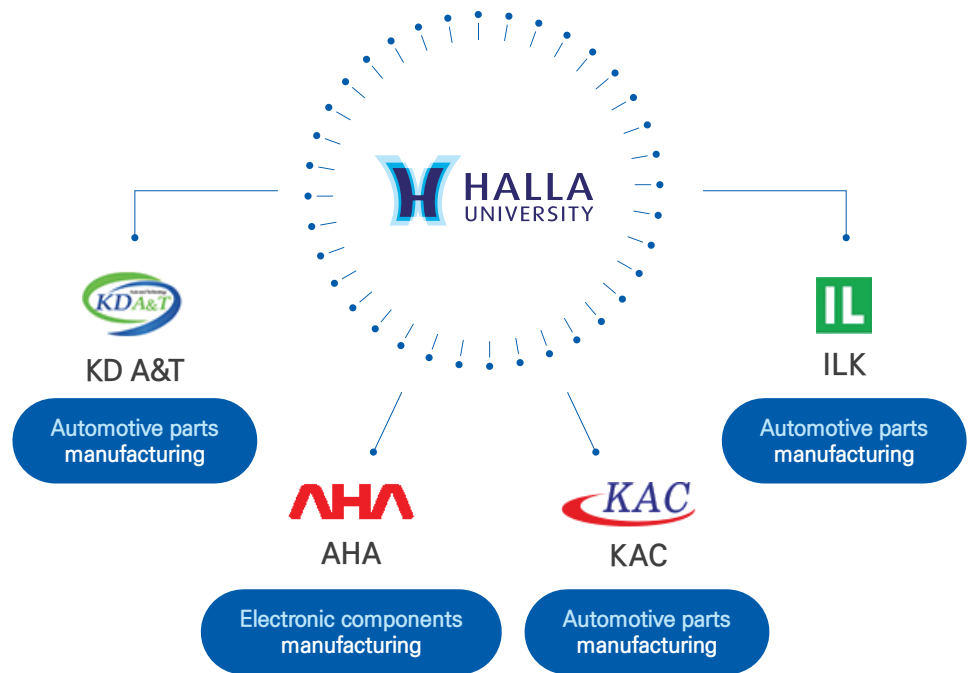

Industry-Linked Field Training Programs

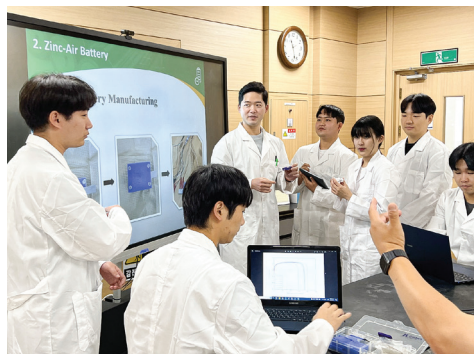

Scholarship Support for International Students

Halla University offers a variety of scholarship programs to support international students in pursuing their studies in a stable environment. International students are generally granted a 40% tuition reduction for their first semester. Additional scholarships may be provided based on recommendations from partner institutions and language proficiency levels such as TOPIK or IELTS. These scholarship programs help reduce the financial burden of tuition and allow students to focus on their studies.

• Department of Mechanical and Automotive Engineering

Through hands-on and field-oriented curricula, this program trains professional engineers in automotive design, manufacturing, and automotive technologies.

• Department of AI and Information Security

Based on artificial intelligence and information security technologies, this program develops professionals in cybersecurity, data protection, and security system development.

• Department of Computer Engineering

This program cultivates specialists in key technologies of the Fourth Industrial Revolution, including big data, artificial intelligence, information security, Internet of Things (IoT), networks, and embedded systems.

• Department of Rail Operation Systems

Through industry-academia collaboration with over 30 railway operators and related institutions such as KORAIL and Seoul Metro, this program trains professionals in railway operation and management. In addition, in connection with the Halla Railway Academy, an official railway driver training institution, it offers a curriculum for obtaining a Class 2 electric train driver's license.

• Department of Urban Infrastructure Engineering

Based on urban planning, safety engineering, and construction engineering (railway infrastructure construction), this program develops professionals for careers in urban and infrastructure development.

• Department of Future Mobility Engineering

Students learn advanced technologies such as AI, big data, coding (software), design, and virtual twins, preparing for careers in next-generation mobility fields including autonomous vehicles, robotics, drones, Urban Air Mobility (UAM), Personal Mobility (PM), MaaS, and TaaS.

• Department of IT Software

This program trains practice-oriented software professionals equipped with programming and application software development skills applicable across diverse IT environments.

• Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering

This program develops skilled professionals with practical competencies in smart electric energy systems, semiconductors, and e-mobility electronic control systems.

• Department of Media Advertising Content

This program cultivates cultural content specialists with creative planning and production capabilities required in the media, advertising, and content industries.

• Department of Video Production

Through comprehensive education in video planning, filming, and editing, this program trains experts in video content production for the digital media era.

College of Wellness and Regional Engagement

• Department of Global Business

This program develops global business professionals equipped with internet-based business, entrepreneurship, and management capabilities to respond to the digital-era global business environment.

• Department of Hotel, Aviation, and Restaurant Management

Through comprehensive education in the tourism service industry, including hotels, airline services, and food service, this program prepares professionals for careers in the global service industry.

• Department of Business Administration

Based on both theory and practical training, this program develops professionals capable of working in various fields such as corporate management, entrepreneurship, and organizational management.

• Department of Cultural Tourism Management

This program educates students in tourism content planning, tourism marketing, and tourism industry management by integrating culture and tourism, cultivating professionals in the cultural tourism sector.

• Department of Beauty Design

This program develops professionals with specialized technical skills and creative sensibility in beauty design and cosmetology, preparing them for careers in the K-Beauty industry.

• Department of Architecture (4- or 5-Year Program)

Through comprehensive education in architecture, including design, structures, construction, environmental systems, and urban planning, this program trains professionals capable of designing creative architectural spaces. It also strengthens future-ready competencies through advanced technologies such as BIM (Building Information Modeling).

* Depending on career goals and curriculum choices, students may pursue either a 4-year or 5-year program.

• Department of Fire Disaster Prevention

This program offers a curriculum designed to train public officials, engineers, and safety managers in the field of fire safety. It develops professionals through theoretical education, hands-on training, field experience, and expert mentoring.

• Department of Social Welfare

As an academic field focused on addressing diverse social issues, this program provides professional knowledge and practical skills to cultivate social welfare specialists who contribute to improving quality of life and promoting social well-being.

• Department of Police Administration

This program prepares students for careers in criminal justice and public institutions such as the police, prosecution, corrections, and coast guard. Through a tailored curriculum and various extracurricular programs, it develops professionals in the field of public safety.

• Department of Sports

Based on both theoretical knowledge and practical skills required in the sports industry, this program trains professionals for careers in the sports industry and sports coaching fields.

02 Eligibility Requirements

Applicants for the international student admission must meet all of the following criteria, including nationality, academic background, and language proficiency requirements.

• Nationality Requirement

Applicants and both parents must be foreign nationals.

※ Only applicants whose parents and themselves acquired foreign nationality before the start of the education equivalent to the Korean high school curriculum are eligible.

• Academic Requirement

Applicants must have completed an educational curriculum equivalent to the 12-year elementary and secondary education system in Korea, or be recognized as having academic qualifications equal to or higher than those of a Korean high school graduate.

• Language Requirement

Applicants must meet the language requirement corresponding to the program they wish to apply for, as outlined below.

※ The issuance of a student visa for international students is determined in accordance with the screening standards of the Ministry of Justice of Korea and overseas diplomatic missions.

• Important Notes on Eligibility

Applicants must carefully review the following items, and all eligibility-related matters will be evaluated according to the standards of Halla University.

• Academic Recognition Criteria

1. Foreign applicants who have completed the entire elementary and secondary education curriculum in countries with less than a 12-year system are recognized as having academic qualifications equivalent to a Korean high school graduate. (Legal basis: Enforcement Decree of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, Article 98, Paragraph 1, Item 9)
2. Applicants who have completed the final three years of an 11-year or 12-year curriculum within the same country are recognized as having completed a high school program. (However, this applies only to those who have completed more than 11 years of elementary and secondary education across two or more countries.)

• Cases Not Recognized for Academic Qualification

1. The following are not accepted as meeting the academic requirement
 - GED (domestic or overseas) · Homeschooling · Cyber learning · Adult education programs

• Transfer Admission Eligibility

1. Only foreign applicants whose parents are both foreign nationals and who have completed at least one year of study at a domestic or overseas university are eligible to apply.
2. The recognition and scope of credits earned at the previous institution will be determined through evaluation by Halla University.

• Important Notes on the Admission Process

1. Admission may be denied if the applicant is deemed to lack sufficient academic ability based on qualification screening and interview results.
2. Evaluation results and detailed assessment criteria of the admission process will not be disclosed.
3. The language used in the interview will vary depending on the program applied for.

03 Application Fee Information

Applicants for the international special admission must pay the following application fee at the time of submission. The application will be considered complete only after the payment has been made.

• Application Fee

• Payment Method

- The application fee must be paid via bank transfer to the designated account.

- The application will be processed only after the payment is completed.
- Any transaction fees incurred during the payment process may be borne by the applicant.

• Application Fee Refund Policy

As a general rule, the application fee is non-refundable. However, all or part of the fee may be refunded upon submission of supporting documents if any of the following cases apply.

- If the applicant overpaid the application fee by mistake
- If the applicant was unable to participate in the admission process due to reasons attributable to the university
- If the applicant was unable to participate due to force majeure such as natural disasters
- If the applicant was unable to participate due to hospitalization caused by illness or accident, or due to the applicant's death

※ Matters regarding application fee refunds are governed by Article 42-3, Paragraph 2 of the Enforcement Decree of the Higher Education Act.



04 Admission Schedule

The international student admission process is conducted in three rounds (1st, 2nd, and 3rd), and each round includes application submission, document screening, interviews, announcement of results, and enrollment procedures according to the schedule below.

• Important Notes on Admission Schedule

Applicants must carefully review the following items, and all admission procedures and related matters will be conducted in accordance with the standards of Halla University.

• Important Notes on Admission and Documents

1. Admission is possible only after obtaining a D-2-2 (student visa for undergraduate freshman or transfer) visa
2. Even if an applicant is admitted and completes registration, admission may be canceled if the visa is denied or entry into Korea is not permitted by the relevant authorities
3. If any false information is found in the application form or submitted documents, the responsibility lies with the applicant, and admission may be revoked
4. If required documents are not submitted or do not arrive within the designated period, the responsibility lies with the applicant
5. Admission schedules may change depending on university circumstances, and updates will be announced on the NOTICE section of the Halla University English website (no individual notification will be provided)

• Visa and Entry Guidelines

1. Admitted applicants must pay tuition and receive the Certificate of Admission issued by the university before applying for a D-2 (student) visa
2. Visa issuance generally takes about 3 to 4 weeks, so applicants are advised to apply immediately after receiving the Certificate of Admission
3. After obtaining the visa, it is recommended to enter Korea by August 28, 2026 (Fri)
4. Applicants must notify the Office of International Talent Development in advance of their arrival schedule
5. The issuance of a student visa is determined according to the screening standards of the Ministry of Justice of Korea and overseas diplomatic missions. Admission may be canceled if the visa is denied
6. The university manages the admission and supervision of international students in accordance with the guidelines of the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Justice

05 Selection Method and Criteria

The international special admission evaluates applicants primarily through interviews to comprehensively assess academic ability, suitability for the chosen major, and motivation for study.

• Selection Method

Selection Component	Weight	Evaluation Criteria
Interview	100%	Comprehensive evaluation of academic ability, major suitability, study motivation, and attitude

• Interview Evaluation Criteria

The interview is conducted based on the following factors

1. Academic ability
2. Understanding of the major and suitability
3. Study plan and motivation
4. Communication skills and potential for academic success

※ The interview may be conducted in the language corresponding to the program applied for

- English track conducted in English · Bilingual track (Chinese) conducted in Chinese
- Applicants residing overseas may be interviewed online

• Selection Criteria

1. Selection is based on the overall interview evaluation
2. Even if there is no limit on the number of admissions, applicants may not be selected if they are deemed to lack sufficient academic ability based on interview results
3. If any false information or document forgery is identified, admission may be canceled
4. Applicants who do not attend the interview will be disqualified
5. Evaluation results and detailed assessment criteria will not be disclosed

• Apostille and Consular Authentication for Academic Documents

2. Documents requiring Apostille: Graduation certificates, transcripts, and other documents issued by overseas schools
3. Issuance Procedure
 - ① Preparation of original documents: Prepare original documents issued by the relevant institution such as a school
 - ② Verification of issuing authority: Confirm the designated authority in the country that can issue an Apostille such as the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or Ministry of Justice
 - ③ Application and fee payment: Submit the original documents and application form and pay the required fee

08 Important Notes for Applicants

1. Application Submission and Personal Information

- ① Applicants must accurately enter personal information such as name, date of birth, contact details, admission type, and program when submitting the application. Any disadvantages caused by errors or omissions are the applicant's responsibility.
- ② After submission, changes or cancellation of the application or admission type are not allowed.

2. Restrictions on Multiple Applications

- ① Multiple applications within the same program at the university are not allowed, and simultaneous enrollment in two or more universities through the international special admission is prohibited.

3. Required Documents

- ① All submitted documents will not be returned.
- ② All documents must be original. If copies are submitted due to unavoidable circumstances, the originals must be submitted within the registration period after admission.
- ③ Documents not written in Korean or English must be accompanied by notarized translations in Korean or English.
- ④ Applicants expected to graduate must submit proof of graduation within the designated period. Failure or delay in submission that results in the inability to obtain a visa may lead to cancellation of admission.

4. Language Proficiency

- ① Applicants planning to submit language proficiency documents may receive conditional admission, provided they submit a TOPIK score report or a certificate and transcript from a language institute.
- ② Admission will be canceled if the final language proficiency documents are not submitted within the deadline or if eligibility requirements are not met.
- ③ Applicants admitted without TOPIK Level 3 must complete at least 300 hours of Korean language courses within one year after admission.
- ④ For graduation, students must achieve at least TOPIK Level 4 or complete Level 4 or higher of the KIIP (for Korean track students).

5. Interview and Identity Verification

- ① Applicants must bring an official ID (passport or alien registration card) on the day of the interview.
- ② For applicants participating in online interviews, identity verification procedures, including presentation of ID before or during the interview, will be conducted.

6. Announcement of Results and Registration

- ① Admitted applicants must pay tuition within the designated registration period. Failure to do so will result in cancellation of admission.

7. Cancellation of Admission

- ① Admission may be canceled in the following cases
 - Submission of forged or falsified documents, failure to meet eligibility requirements, or involvement in fraudulent activities such as proxy testing
 - Failure to enter Korea due to visa denial
 - Inability to extend or change visa status under immigration regulations

09 Foreigner Registration and Stay Management

International students must complete foreigner registration within a specified period after entering Korea in accordance with the Immigration Act, and must comply with regulations related to maintaining and changing their visa status.

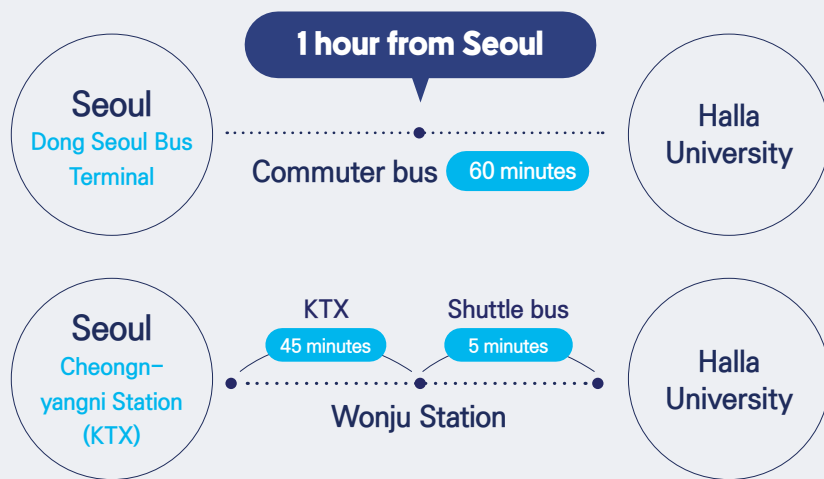
